



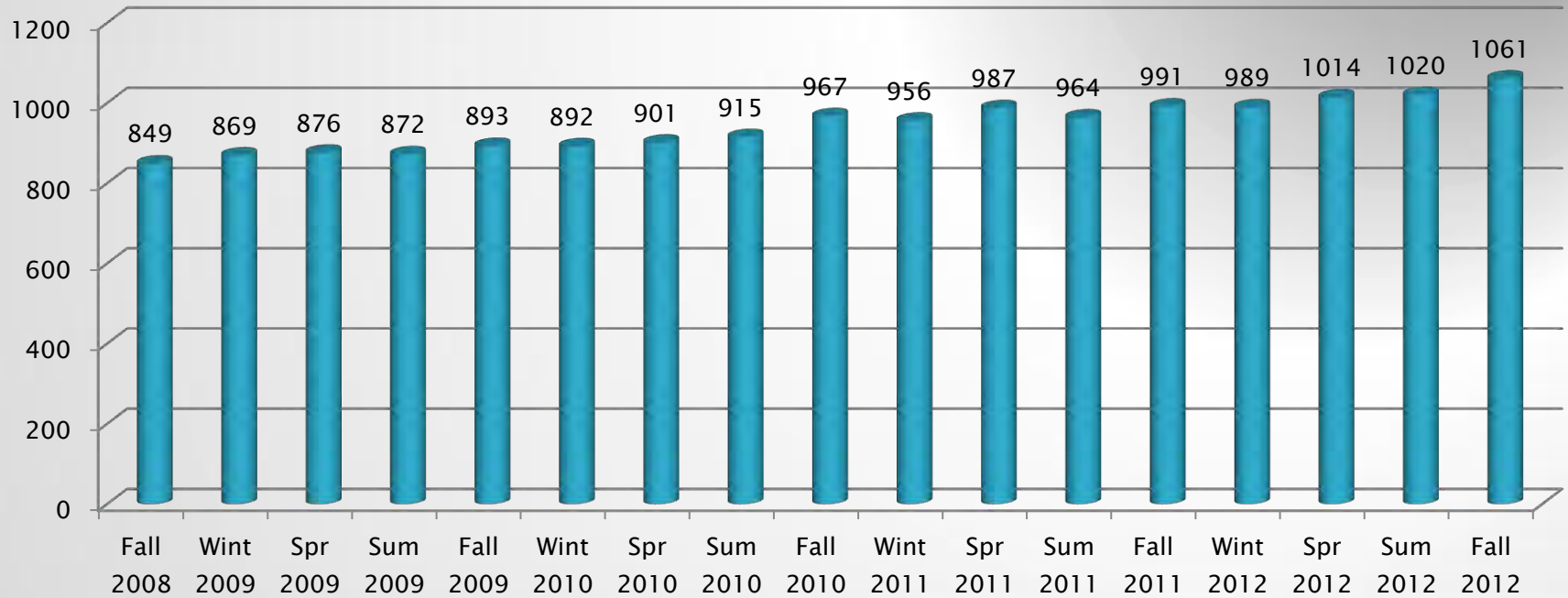

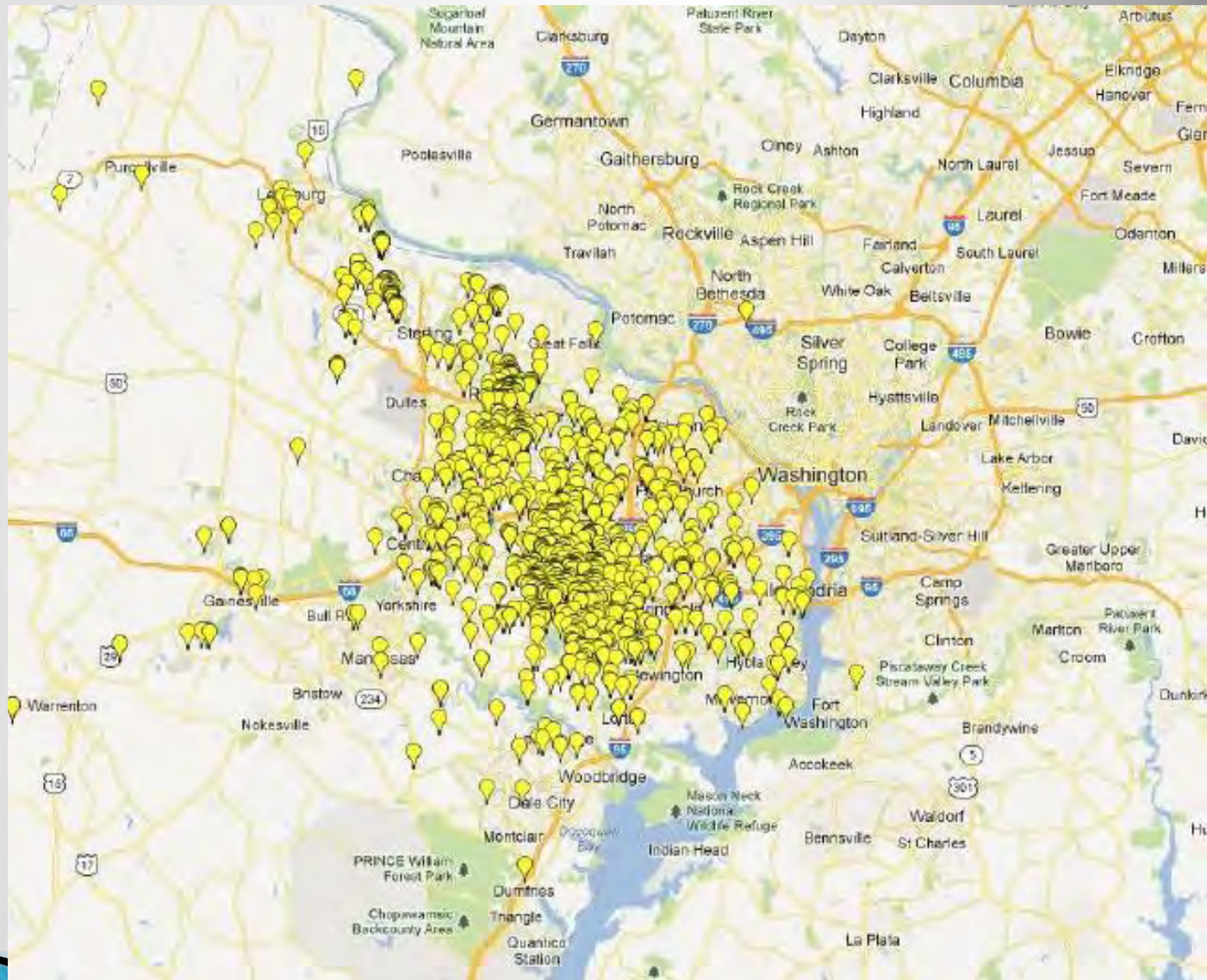
2012 Highlights

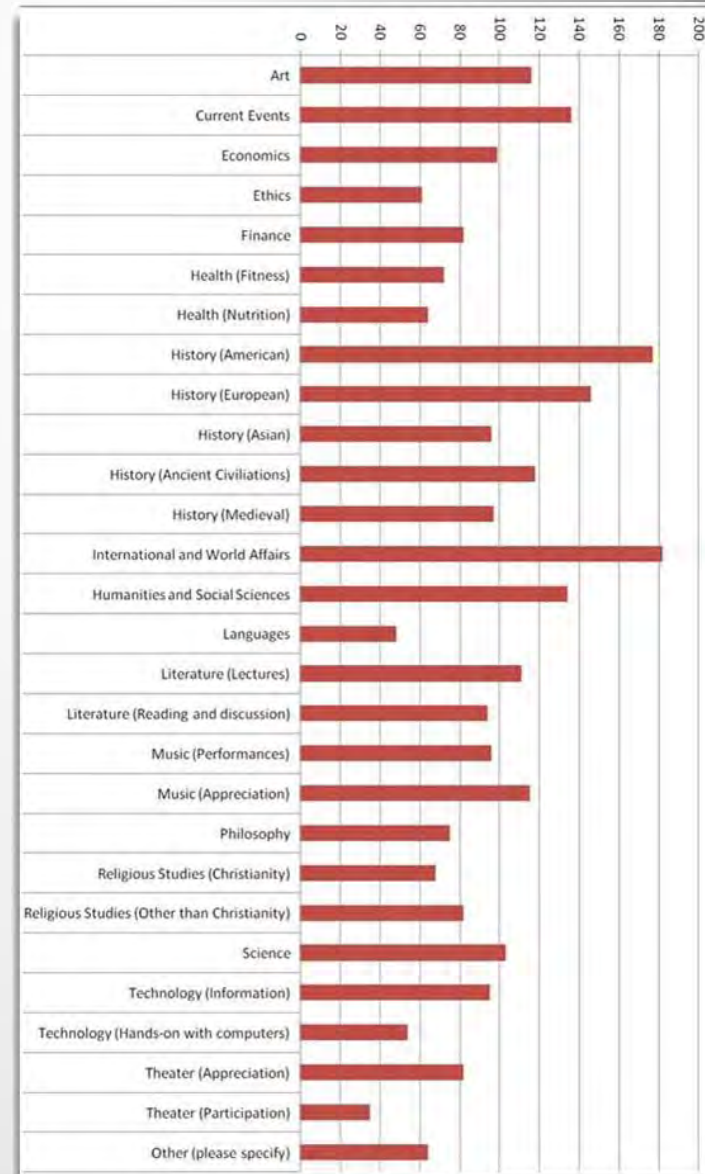

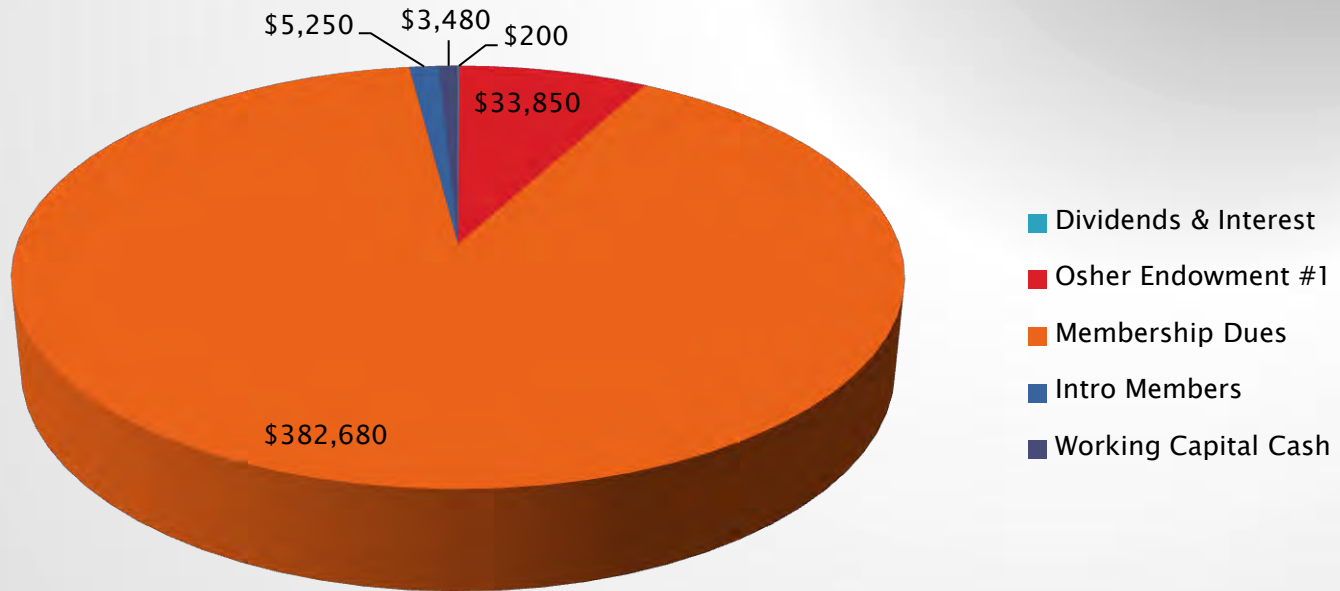

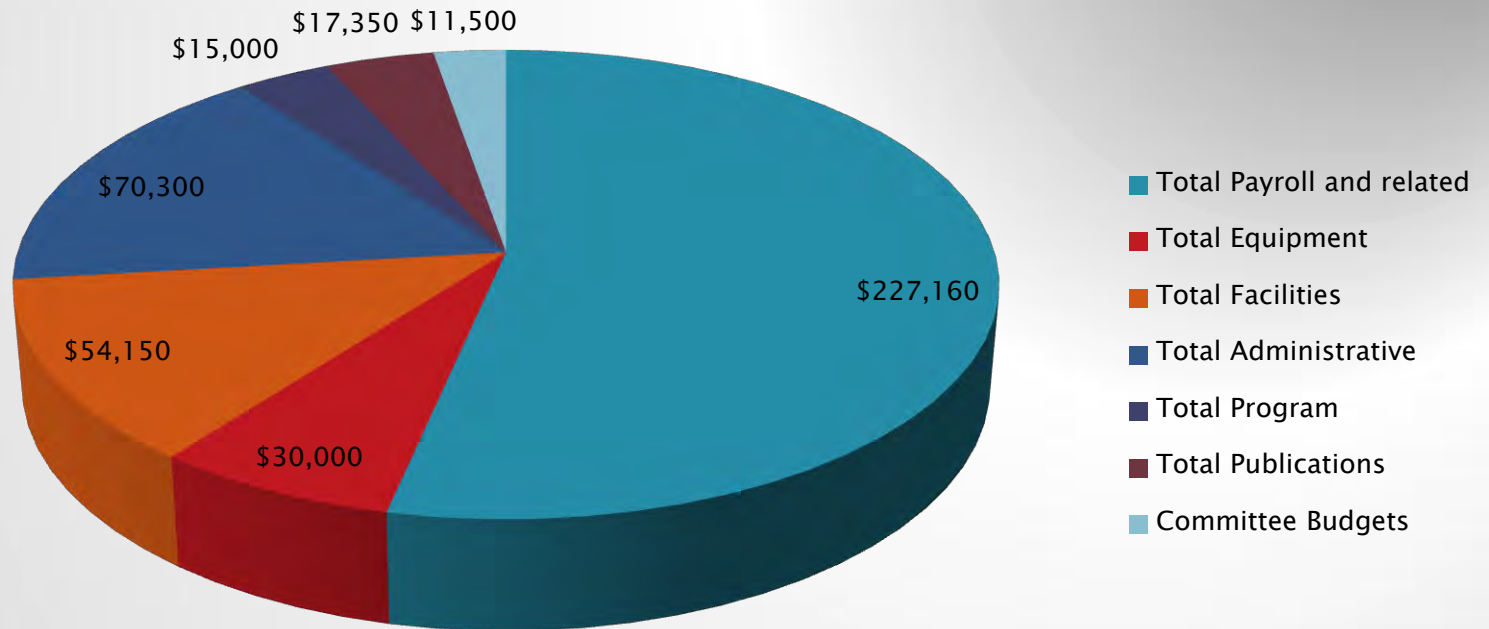

Resolved: The Board accepts the following Position Statement from the OLLI Program Committee.

The Program Committee of OLLI at George Mason University supports the use of technology to enhance and expand learning opportunities for OLLI members. We encourage new methods for teaching, communicating, and learning in a wide variety of formats. This includes the use of videoconferencing capabilities to enable OLLI members to participate actively in classroom presentations from multiple locations as appropriate. We recognize that videoconferencing would not be appropriate for some types of classes and should not replace the live interactive nature that OLLI members prefer. Therefore, we encourage the OLLI Board of Directors to support the efforts of the OLLI Audiovisual Support Committee and the OLLI Executive Director to investigate and provide recommendations on reasonable and affordable options which would make videoconferencing possible.
