Film Screening: Last Days of Vietnam

George Mason University, in partnership with local veterans organizations, is hosting a free screening of Rory Kennedy's 2014 Academy Award-nominated documentary film, *Last Days in Vietnam*. This screening coincides with Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day, so the film will be preceded by a brief ceremony honoring veterans. It will be followed by a panel discussion featuring Professor Meredith Lair (a historian of the Vietnam War); Captain Paul Jacobs, who participated in the US evacuation of Saigon and is featured in the film; and Dave Nguyen, a prominent member of the Northern Virginia Vietnamese community who will speak to the impact of the fall of Saigon and the ensuing refugee crisis on South Vietnamese people.

This event is also part of Mason's commitment to honor the 50th anniversary of the Vietnam War as an official commemorative partner of the United States Vietnam War Commemoration, sponsored by the Department of Defense (http://www.vietnamwar50th.com/).

The screening will be held at 6:30 on Sunday, March 29, in the Johnson Center Cinema on the Fairfax Campus.
