

Gentle readers: One of the OLLI staff was recently approached by a member who was distracted by another OLLI member knitting or doing needlepoint during class. The staff member wondered, "Is that an OLLI etiquette 'no'?"

Ms. Ettakit confesses possible bias on this question, because during her college experience (albeit at a college for women) knitting was viewed as acceptable behavior during class if the professor had okayed it. Given that one can knit and still pay attention, knitting may not be a problem in itself. But knitting in the front of the room may be distracting to the instructor or other students. Quiet knitting, in the back of the room, respecting the personal space of those around you, should be fine. Needlepoint is even less "active" than knitting, and Ms. Ettakit sees no problem
