

Mason's School of Theater and School of Music Proudly Present *The Gondoliers*

You are invited to join the Theater Lovers' Group to attend a performance of *The Gondoliers* at the Center for the Arts Concert Hall on Sunday, October 29, at 4:00. *The Gondoliers*, written by Gilbert and Sullivan, premiered at the Savoy Theatre in 1889, where it ran for a record 554 performances, closing in 1891. It was performed at a command performance for Queen Victoria and the royal family at Windsor Castle in 1891, the only Gilbert and Sullivan opera to be so honored.

The Gondoliers, a comic opera set in Venice, wittily and humorously satirizes class distinctions. The hilarity starts when a gaggle of gondoliers is told that one of them is the heir to the throne of Barataria. The question is, "Which one?, due to an error of identity that was made when they were young. This musical theater piece delights as it subtly lampoons the tribulations of governing and romance.

You – and your guests – can enjoy the bubbling champagne quality of the libretto, subtle satire, and humorous melodies for \$15, senior rate. You can purchase your tickets at the Center for the Arts Concert Hall box office, online, or by phone 888-945-2468.
